

ORDINANCE NO. 361

An Ordinance to regulate, prohibit and prescribe the shooting or exploding of Fireworks in the City of Roanoke, Alabama, and in the Police Jurisdiction thereof:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROANOKE, ALABAMA as follows:

SECTION 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person or individual to shoot or explode or aid and abet in the shooting or exploding of any fireworks or similar devices in the City of Roanoke, Alabama, or in the Police Jurisdiction thereof at any time and place, except on the private premises of the person or individual so shooting or aiding or abetting in the shooting of said fireworks or similar devices.

SECTION 2: That it shall be unlawful for any person or individual to shoot or explode, or aid and abet in the shooting or exploding of any fireworks or similar devices in the City of Roanoke, Alabama, or the Police Jurisdiction thereof, on any Sunday;

SECTION 3: That any person individual who shoots or explodes or aids and abets in the shooting or exploding of any fireworks or

similar devices in the City of Roanoke, Alabama, contrary to Section 1 and 2 of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of from One Cent to One Hundred Dollars, and may also be sentenced to six months hard labor on the streets of the City of Roanoke.
